Fund for Armenian Relief (FAR) has five soup kitchens in different parts of Armenia. Together, they serve 732 people. Because their budgets are tight (and especially lately due to inflation), they are not usually able to serve a traditional Armenian Christmas meal (centered around fish and pilaf).

This year, there are no plans for any festive meal as the soup kitchens will be closed from December 30 to January 9. Of course, it will be a big surprise for all the beneficiaries if there is a traditional Christmas dinner celebration planned for their return.

The meal will include fish, pilaf with dried fruits, salad, wine and maybe even cake. Will you help us make it happen?

15-year-old Oksanna lives in Verin Getashen, close to the city of Martuni on the banks of Lake Sevan. She wants to become a psychologist to help other children with disabilities like her. Eka, the director of Voskeporik Development Center where Oksanna attends, has promised to give her a job if she studies well.

10-year-old Ishkhan wants to become a professional chess player. He also wants to study math.

In order to achieve their dreams, both Oksanna and Ishkhan need a laptop computer. Will you help us make their dreams come true?

We want to surprise the 500+ children that attend both centers with gifts... gifts with a purpose. For Voskeporik kids, we'll purchase beautiful hats knit by moms of children with disabilities and also women who have lost their sons on the front. For the Aregak kids, we'll purchase ZarMan toys. ZarMan is a social enterprise that employs people with disabilities and parents of special needs kids to create beautiful, high-quality development toys.

## Wish 8: A helping hand

14-year-old Nare has spastic cerebral palsy and is unable to walk. She lives alone in Gyumri with her single mother Lilik, a former military nurse. Lilik never complains about the difficulties of mothering Nare, which includes lifting her to the toilet and showering her. However, recently, Lilik fell and broke her leg. For the past couple of months, Lilik has had to rely on her middle-aged sister to lift Nare.

Although Lilik is on the path to recovery, in order to heal properly, she should not lift Nare for several more months. If there were to be long-term serious damage to her leg, she would not be able to continue caring for Nare down the road (and she is Nare's sole caretaker).

We want to purchase a special electric lift device that will help to carry Nare to the toilet and shower so that Lilik doesn't have to lift her full weight. We also want to purchase another one to gift the Emili Aregak Center, a therapy center in Gyumri where Nare attends, to have on call for families in other sort of emergency situations.

Thanks to you, the center has a beloved "social library" from which parents of special needs kids can borrow development games and books to ensure that their children continue to make active progress even while at home!

We wanted to support the center again this year because they are so goal-oriented and active in supporting their children! This year, they want to work on developing their kids' physical fitness. To do so, the center wants to purchase a few pieces of small gym equipment including a treadmill, a bike and a trampoline. These will be used not only by the special needs kids but also by their siblings and peers as a part of physical therapy, and to promote exercise and fun.

Tigran's older brother will also go to the army in January for his mandatory two-year military service.

Tigran loves to eat eggs in the morning; he is currently collecting money to purchase chickens so that his family can raise hens and produce their own eggs rather than buying them. He has already collected 1400 AMD (\$3.50). We want to surprise him with money for 25 chickens so that his family can produce their own eggs and have some extra to sell!

We will also buy 25 chickens for another family in a similar situation.

Hrach has never forgotten the feelings he had on October 2, 2020, when an enemy ATS blew up his neighbor's house, killing her. Hrach and his sisters, thank God, were not harmed that night.

Hrach's top dream is peace for the Armenian people. He himself dreams of having a bicycle. He has never had one.

We would like to buy three bicycles for children like Hrach.

#### Wish 4: The beloved calf

8-year-old Sasha has cerebral palsy. He lives in the village of Mets Masrik with his parents, grandparents, seven-year-old sister and one-year-old brother.

Sasha's dad Andranik is a contracted soldier. He has been stationed at posts since September 13, the day after Azerbaijan attacked Armenian border villages. His grandmother and mother work very long hours.

Sasha's parents had a calf that they were raising to provide milk for the family. On September 13, the calf never came home from the fields. Sasha thinks it was stolen; more than likely, the cow fled because of the shelling. Every day, he tells his teacher how his family's calf went to the field and never came home, and how his mother and grandmother cried.

According to his teacher, Sasha took the loss of his calf so much to heart that a psychologist is working with the child. While we can't replace the family's beloved animal, we want to at least provide them with a new calf to help provide for the family and comfort Sasha.

#### Wish 3: A warm hearth

Last year, one of the most beloved gifts in our #ChristmasWishlist was a gas stove for the soup kitchen run by Fund for Armenian Relief in Byureghavan. Thanks to your support, we raised about \$2000. The new stove allows the soup kitchen staff to more effectively prepare meals for the 150 vulnerable elderly people who come for lunch five days a week.

This year, we want to give the same gift to the soup kitchen in Nor Hachn, which also serves more than 150 people (from 71 families) daily.

There are four dedicated employees working in the soup kitchen who use 28-year-old equipment, including a Soviet-era gas stove and a poorly functioning small Aragats refrigerator from the 1960s.

Director Rafik Martirosyan is excited to lighten the administrative burden of the soup kitchen staff ahead of the holidays with the purchase of a new, powerful gas stove.

As the soup kitchen will be closed for a few days over the holidays, we also want to provide small food packages for the 71 families who rely on the meals they eat there.
